Dialogue on US-Nepal Trade and Investment: Prospects and Challenges

On September 9th 2024, USAID T&C, Nepal-USA Chamber of Commerce and Industry (NUSACCI), Federation of Nepalese Chamber of Commerce and Industry (FNCCI), Garment Association Nepal (GAN) and Federation of Export Entrepreneurs Association Nepal (FEEN) jointly organized a half-day dialogue entitled "US-Nepal Trade and Investment: Prospects and Challenges," on September 9th 2024, at Silver Oak Banquet & Event Center, Gairidhara.

This program aims to provide recommendations to the Government of Nepal (GoN) and the United States Trade Representative (USTR) as part of private sector initiatives for the 7th Trade and Investment Framework Agreement (TIFA) Council Meeting to be held on September 16th 2024.

The program divided into three sessions: opening remarks/remarks sessions followed by commentator sessions

He highlighted that today marks a significant moment as we focus on strengthening US-Nepal trade and investment relations, with special attention to challenges and opportunities ahead. FNCCI, as the apex body of Nepal's private sector, has been actively involved in the Trade and **Investment Framework** Agreement (TIFA) dialogue, and we are strongly advocating for the extension of the Nepal **Trade Preference Program** (NTPP) beyond 2025, as well as the renewal of the Generalized System

with increasing exports and growing demand, especially from the Nepali diaspora. Our main goal is to boost trade, diversify exports, and attract more US Foreign Direct Investment, particularly in emerging sectors like IT and tourism, while also addressing the future challenges-Nepal's LDC graduation in 2026. This event provides an opportunity to engage stakeholders and work toward actionable recommendations that will benefit both countries

As a background paper for the discussion, Dr. Paras Kharel, Executive Director, South Asia Watch

paper entitled "US-Nepal Merchandise Trade: An Anatomy" covering GSP, NTPP and TIFA. He also highlighted the trend in NTP products. He remarked that NTP products in the US represented an import market of US\$ 13 billion in 2021.

Kiran P. Saakha, President, Nepal-USA Chamber of Commerce and Industry highlighted the significant role that the Ready-Made Garment (RMG) sector played in Nepal's exports to the United States from 1980 to 2004. During this period, RMG exports reached their peak.

to the USA. Despite these challenges, exporters remain well-aware of the market requirements, demand, quality standards, pricing, and sensitivities. As such, the RMG sector presents an opportunity for revival, with the potential for a 500-fold increase in exports.

It is crucial for the Nepalese government to give serious attention to reviving this market. In 1999, the private sector raised concerns with the Nepal Government regarding the loss of market share, signaling the need for urgent action. The U.S. Trade Representative (USTR) had previously authorized Garment Association Nepal (GAN) to recommend garment visas, based on recommendations from the private sector to the government. At the turn of the century, Nepal's exports to the USA reached \$229 million, but unfortunately, this trend reversed in the following years. However, with

Current Export Landscape and Government Support

While the RMG sector faces challenges, Nepal's carpet exports still hold a significant 15% share of the U.S. market. There is a clear need for government support to further promote this sector. T r a d e The



Key Concerns for Bilateral Trade and Investment

USA's primary concerns include Nepal's compensation laws and the need for reforms to attract U.S. foreign direct investment (FDI). Equally important is the issue of Intellectual Property Rights (IPR), with the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO) working alongside the Nepal Government to strengthen IPR enforcement in Nepal. In June 2024, NUSACCI collaborated with USPTO to organize a half-day seminar to raise awareness of these issues within the private sector.

Another major challenge for Nepal is the prevalence of piracy in software. Due to the high cost of licensed software (ranging from \$500 for hardware to \$1,500 for software), this issue remains a significant barrier to investment.

As the expiration of the Nepal Pandey, President, Federation Trade Preference Program (NTPP) approaches in December 2025, it is essential for stakeholders to clarify the need for its renewal, backed by appropriate statistical data. For product development and expansion of trade opportunities, it is vital for Nepal to seek technical assistance from the United States. particularly in organizing trade fairs and single-country shows.

In conclusion, there is immense potential for growth in Nepal's exports to the USA, particularly in the RMG sector. With targeted government support, effective use of trade agreements like TIFA, and addressing key concerns such as IPR and compensation laws, Nepal can revitalize its trade relations with the United States and unlock new avenues for growth.
